

<u>HOLY DAYS of OBLIGATION</u> – a) Sundays throughout the year; b) Christmas Day – December 25th; c) Circumcision of the Lord – January 1st; d) Ascension of the Lord; e) Dormition/Assumption of the BVM – August 15th; f) All Saints – November 1st; g) Conception of the BVM – December 8th.

MEMBERS DUES 2010. Since January 2005, a change was made that eliminated the 'family plan' method for paying Church dues. This change was voted upon and approved at the last General Synod.

Each adult member (18 years old+) will now be recorded as an individual unit. This means every adult member is now responsible for his/her own dues. To continue to be a member at the Holy Ghost Parish and a member of the Polish National Catholic Church each adult will be responsible for paying the following:

Total dues for 2010 per Adult Member: \$95.00 Per Year

The parish itself has an obligation to pay dues according to the number of active members to the General Church and Diocese and our financial administration distributes these monies also as directed by the General Synod. A breakdown of where these dollars are sent is available upon request.

There are also many other funds within your parish that require your attention and need your donations:

Sunday Collection, Fuel Fund, Cemetery Fund, Clergy/Pension Fund, Easter Donations, Bleenie Sales (we had a great time last year, come out help out, join in the fun...), Chinese Auction, and Christmas Donations.

Receiving the Holy Eucharist – those who believe in the true presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist are invited to partake of this Holy Sacrament. It is the practice of the PNCC to distribute the Holy Eucharist through the method of intinction. The Body and Blood of Christ is placed on the tongue, not in the hand.

FROM THE CATECHISM of the PNCC – The Third Commandment of God: "Remember To Keep Holy The Sabbath Day".

"The Third Commandment requires of us to keep holy the Lord's Day. We observe Sunday as the Lord's Day because our Lord Jesus Christ arose from the dead on that day and on Sunday the Holy Ghost descended upon the disciples. We should celebrate Sundays and Holy Days of obligation by: a) dedicating them to God; b) attending Mass; c) listening to the Word of God; d) prayer and the receiving of Holy Communion; e) special acts of charity. The Third Commandment forbids all unnecessary servile work and whatever else that prevents us from observing the Lord's Day properly."
