

CONFESSIONS FOR THE YOUTH – Our younger members as well as their parents are reminded that Confession is an essential part of a child's religious upbringing. Remember this important part of their religious life. Confession is held on the **first Sunday** of every month at **10:45AM** (before Mass). Children before Confirmation age should come to **private** Confession. If children (until Confirmation) would like to receive the Holy Communion in a worthy manner they must come for private confession at least once a month. If other times are necessary please contact Fr. Robert.

Receiving the Holy Eucharist – those who believe in the true presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist are invited to partake of this Holy Sacrament. It is the practice of the PNCC to distribute the Holy Eucharist through the method of intinction. The Body and Blood of Christ are placed on the tongue, not in the hand.

MEMBERS DUES 2011. Since January 2005, a change was made that eliminated the 'family plan' method for paying Church dues. This change was voted upon and approved at the last General Synod. Each adult member will now be recorded as an individual unit. This means every adult member is now

responsible for his/her own dues. To continue to be a member at the Holy Ghost Parish and a member of the Polish National Catholic Church each adult will be responsible for paying the following:

Total dues for 2011 per Adult Member: <u>\$95.00 Per Year</u>

The parish itself has an obligation to pay dues according to the number of active members to the General Church and Diocese and our financial administration distributes these monies also as directed by the General Synod. A breakdown of where these dollars are sent is available upon request.

There are also many other funds within your parish that require your attention and need your donations:

Sunday Collection, Fuel Fund, Cemetery Fund, Clergy/Pension Fund, Easter Donations, Bleenie Sales (we had a great time last year, come out help out, join in the fun...), Chinese Auction, and Christmas Donations.

PARISH CATECHISM – *What is absolutely necessary to get to heaven?* To get to heaven it is necessary to be in the state of grace. *How do you obtain God's grace?* The ordinary way of obtaining God's grace is through the Sacraments. *What is the Sacrament?* A Sacrament is a sign made sacred by Jesus Christ to give grace to one who worthily receives it.

WHAT TO DO FOR YOUR PASTOR?

Build his spiritual power by praying for him. When you pray for your pastor, you pray for your church, your community, and your family.

Build his reputation by speaking well of him. All pastors are human; they have weak and strong points. His influence will depend on which of them you stress.

Build his morale by encouraging him. Every pastor needs to be encouraged at times. Encouragement costs so little, yet it means so much!

Build his leadership by cooperating with him. For every great leader, there must be some great followers.

Build his pulpit power by coming to hear him. Full pews challenge a pastor to prepare and deliver great sermons. Empty pews can discourage him.

By far the greatest you can do for your pastor is to follow the Christ who he preaches and exemplifies.
