Matki Boskiej Zielnej, or the Mother of God of the Herbs, was for our immigrant ancestors and for many of today's Polish National Catholics, a day of thanksgiving when the first fruits of the harvest are properly offered to God. Herbs, flowers, wheat and vegetables are woven into wreaths and special bouquets. The bouquets, adorned with blue ribbons in Mary's honor, are taken to the church for a blessing. Following the blessing, the bouquets are kept in the home as dried decorations enhancing the beauty of the interior; often they are hang on the porch, until the same day the following year. *(from "Teacher's Manual Central Diocese of the PNCC)*
