

<u>CONFESSIONS FOR THE YOUTH</u> – Our younger members as well as their parents are reminded that Confession is an essential part of a child's religious upbringing. Remember this important part of their religious life. Confession is held on the **first Sunday** of every month at

10:45AM (before Mass). Children before Confirmation age should come to **private** Confession. <u>If children</u> (until Confirmation) would like to receive the Holy Communion in a worthy manner they must come for private confession at least once a month. If other times are necessary please contact Fr. Robert.

<u>THE PARISH CATECHISM</u> – *What is the greatest act of worship offered to God*? The Mass is the greatest and highest act of public worship given to Almighty God. *What is the Mass*? The Mass is the sacrifice of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

FORGIVENESS AND THE EUCHARIST – People often ask if it right to receive the Eucharist into an unforgiving heart. If you are in a state of alienation from someone and you have no desire to do anything about healing the hurt on both sides, then, objectively speaking, it would be a contradiction to receive the Eucharist. The presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and the presence of Jesus in our neighbor are inseparable. The Eucharist is not a reward for doing good but an aid to help us to do good.

HATING ONE'S FAMILY

In today's Gospel, Jesus says something shocking, "Anyone who comes to me without hating father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, cannot be my disciple." We should realize that it was intended to provoke a response. If we took his words literally, it would be the exact opposite of all that he preached. But are the words meant in the literal sense?

Jesus used what we might call "reverse psychology" to elicit a commitment from his disciples. Many came to him because he was a free physician. They had only a passing or no interest in his teachings. His words might be interpreted to say, "Anyone who wants to be my follower must love me far more than he does his own father, mother, wife, children, brothers, or sisters--yes, more than his own life--otherwise he cannot be my disciple."



Receiving the Holy Eucharist – those who believe in the true presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist are invited to partake of this Holy Sacrament. It is the practice of the PNCC to distribute the Holy Eucharist through the method of intinction. The Body and Blood of Christ is placed on the tongue, not in the hand.

ONESIMUS

Paul spent much of his ministry in the Roman province of Asia—now known as Turkey. He made a number of converts in Colossae, a city about 80 miles east of Ephesus. Among these was the family of Philemon, a wealthy slave owner. One of the slaves, Onesimus, whose name means "useful", followed Paul after the apostle left. Runaway slaves could be killed with impunity. Paul wrote a short note to Philemon to plead on behalf of Onesimus. Apparently he was successful, because in the 20th century a plaque was found near Colossae. It was a tribute to someone named "Philemon from his beloved Onesimus". A coincidence?
