

CONFESSIONS FOR THE YOUTH – Our younger members as well as their parents are reminded that Confession is an essential part of a child's religious upbringing. Remember this important part of their religious life. Confession is held on the **first Sunday** of every month at **10:45AM** (before Mass). Children before Confirmation age should come to **private** Confession. <u>If children (until Confirmation)</u> would like to receive the Holy Communion in a worthy manner they must come for private confession at least once a month. If other times are necessary please contact Fr. Robert.

<u>THE PARISH CATECHISM</u> – *What must you do to save your immortal soul?* To save your immortal soul you must: give up your serious sins and live according to all teachings given in this course of instructions. *What is death?* Death is the separation of the soul from the body.

**Receiving the Holy Eucharist** – those who believe in the true presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist are invited to partake of this Holy Sacrament. It is the practice of the PNCC to distribute the Holy Eucharist through the method of intinction. The Body and Blood of Christ are placed on the tongue, not in the hand.

### **THE MISSING LAMPS**

In a certain mountain village in Europe several centuries ago, a nobleman wondered what legacy he should leave to his townspeople. At last he decided to build them a church.

Now one saw the complete plans for the church until it was finished. When the people gathered, they marveled at its beauty and completeness. The someone asked, "But where are the lamps? How will it be lighted?"

The nobleman pointed to some brackets in the walls. Then he gave to each family a lamp which they were to bring with them each time they came to worship.

"Each time you are here the area where you are seated will be lighted," the nobleman said. "Each time you are not here, that area will be dark. This is to remind you that whenever you fail to come to church, some part of God's house will be dark."

**Sacrament of Baptism** – Arrangements should be made at least two weeks prior the ceremony. Only **practicing Christians** should be chosen as **godparents**.

**Sacrament of Matrimony** – Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance.

<u>LITURGY IN THE CHURCH</u> – Liturgy today is understood as the cultic worship of the Church, but we need to stress that originally liturgy entailed the voluntary work of the people. The liturgy of the Church, we must emphasize from the outset, cannot be relegated to *days of obligation* and the labors of the ordained. Liturgy should be a central and continous expression of the entire Church's love of Christ in cultic worship. The celebration of Mass and other liturgies should be entered into freely. Liturgy should be a spiritually renewing experience for all in the Church. *(Understanding the Liturgical Calendar, by Fr. Randolph Calvo)*.
