MONDAY, December 21st – Feast – St. Thomas, Apostle

Among the apostles, Thomas is remembered mainly for his doubts about the resurrection of Christ. Eight days after the Resurrection, he made up for his unbelief with a profession of faith, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:28). According to tradition, he preached the Gospel in India, where he was martyred.

SATURDAY, December 26th – Feast – St. Stephen, Proto-Martyr

St. Stephen was a deacon in the early Church and was the first Christian martyred for his faith. He was one of the seven deacons who helped the apostles and was "filled with faith and with the Holy Spirit", and was "full of fortitude". Stephen died praying for his executioners. The similarities between Stephen's martyrdom and the crucifixion of Our Lord emphasize his imitation of Christ even unto the complete gift of self.

The Tradition Spreads

On December 6, 1492, Christopher Columbus landed in a part of what is now the country of Haiti. Grateful sailor that he was, he named this site after St. Nicholas. The Dutch brought their traditions of St. Nicholas Day to America in the 1700s. These traditions became very popular, especially in the 1800s. The Dutch called St. Nicholas "Sint-Niklass" which, of course, was translated into English as you guessed it – "Santa Claus."

Throughout the 1800s, the stories and celebrations grew and also changed as Dutch traditions mixed with those of others who came to the United States, especially the German and the English.

Today we celebrate the spirit of Santa Claus on December 25 as part of our Christmas celebration, but it's good to remember that it all started way back in history with the very brave, loving and faithful Bishop of Myra, who loved and shared because he wanted to follow Jesus.

Receiving the Holy Eucharist – those who believe in the true presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist are invited to partake of this Holy Sacrament. It is the practice of the PNCC to distribute the Holy Eucharist through the method of intinction. The Body and Blood of Christ is placed on the tongue, not in the hand.
